Highlights

After many years of vague reports of poaching by a specific group of individuals, SCO Jerry Hugo gathered and compiled enough information to birth the Snow Peak action plan called Operation Snowball. Snowball included locations of camps, bait sites, and shooting stands, and a number of participants. Violations were reported to include illegal baiting, closed season elk harvest, hunting without licenses & tags, over-limit of elk, and construction of illegal structures.

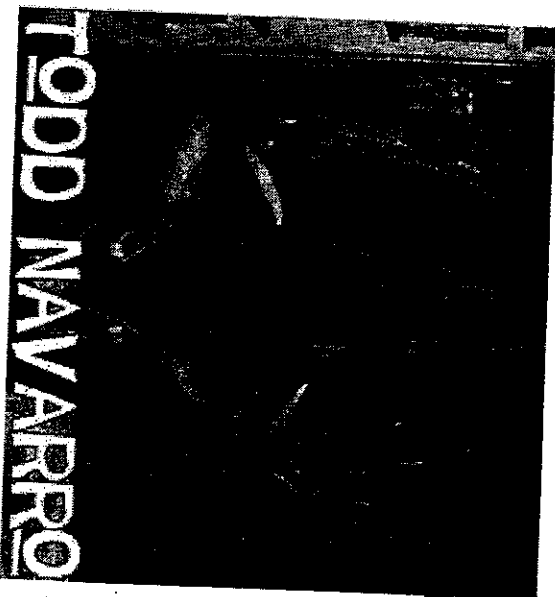
Several officers from two different regions were involved, some posing as hunters, some posted in the Snow Peak lookout for surveillance, and the rest conducting uniformed patrol. After a four-day operation, six different individuals were contacted by uniform personnel and one search warrant was served in the nearby town of Avery. Citations were written for 17 charges, ranging from fishing without a license to transfer of tag, to taking an elk during closed season.

After ten months of hearings, motions, and agreements, the case netted guilty pleas to six charges, with charges still pending against one man for USFS violations. Fines totaled \$2,509, and restitutions to IDFG and CAP totaled \$1,975. The main character, Mr. Buck Moore, was also given a 60 day suspended jail sentence.

A Naples man entered an Alford plea in a case involving the illegal taking of a trophy whitetail buck last November. In entering the plea, he accepted a plea bargain offered by the Boundary County prosecutor, which reduced the charge from a felony to a misdemeanor. He was sentenced to 180 days in the County jail, with all but 10 suspended. He was also ordered to pay a \$1,000 misdemeanor fine and \$2,000 in civil restitution to the Idaho Fish and Game Department. His hunting privileges were suspended for three years, and he was placed on two years probation.

The case against him began last January when local Fish and Game officers received a tip that he had killed a trophy white-tailed buck and had used his son's tag on the deer. Officers found a photo of him posing with the deer at Far North Outfitters in Bonners Ferry. The photo was also posted on Far North's web site. Further investigation revealed that he had already killed a deer prior to when the trophy buck was taken.

On January 18, officers served a search warrant at his residence near Naples, seizing the head from the trophy buck as well as three smaller bucks. A computer containing digital photos of the deer, a digital camera, deer tags, and several packages of deer meat were also seized. The antlers from the trophy buck scored 170 Boone and Crocket points, making its unlawful taking a felony in Idaho.

Game wardens nab 5 suspects

Hunters allegedly killed elk in St. Joe River area

Idaho conservation officers worked undercover last month to track five hunters suspected of illegally killing elk deep in the St. Joe River backcountry.

The work involved everything from spying on the hunters from high ridgetops to keeping a close watch on a house in Avery where the hunters were suspected of storing their quarry, said Jerry Hugo, the senior conservation officer who organized the effort, dubbed "Operation Snowball."

Most of the violations that Hugo encounters fit the category of opportunity killings – shooting a deer on the side of the road, for example. That wasn't the case here, Hugo said.

"These folks were intentional violators. They had it in mind before the season started what they were going to do," he said, adding that he takes pleasure in making such arrests. "These guys generally have all the meat they could ever eat, but they just keep on killing. ... Those are the guys all game wardens like to get."

Arrested in the operation were West Virginia residents Richard L. Eddy, John D. Mathews and C.W. Mathews; and Avery residents Buckner A. Moore and Michelle M. Castner. The five were charged in Shoshone County with a combined 14 violations, including shooting from a public road, hunting elk without a tag and hunting elk outside of the season. A bull and a calf elk were illegally killed by the group, according to the charges.

Hearing dates have not yet been set for the charges, said Mariah Pugh, deputy county prosecutor. Phone numbers could not be found for the West Virginia hunters. Neither Castner nor Moore could be reached for comment Friday.

Operation Snowball came about after several years of reports of possible illegal activity being committed by the group, Hugo said. Game wardens are responsible for covering upward of 2,000 square miles of terrain – which makes it tough to venture alone into the backcountry to investigate crimes, Hugo said.

Eight other game wardens were enlisted for the operation. Some backpacked into the Snow Peak Wildlife Management area southeast of Avery to set up camp. Others used horses and posed as hunters. The wardens worked 15-hour days watching the hunters.

They had trouble gathering evidence, however, because fog, rain and snow often made it impossible to track the group of hunters, said Mark Rhodes, supervising conservation officer for the Coeur d'Alene District.

Eventually, the key piece of evidence was gathered when an undercover officer in Avery spotted members of the group dump something in a trash bin. It was the head of a cow elk. The officer quickly took a temperature

reading and determined it was too cold to have been shot that day, which was the opening day of the season.

The five suspects were arrested Oct. 16.

Although the weather thwarted some of their efforts, Rhodes said the operation was also meant to send a message that game wardens do more than watch the side of the road.

"There's a perception that we mostly just drive around in our trucks, but that's not always the case," Rhodes said.

Hugo agreed. "We're going to go where the violators are. We don't care where they're at."

Not only do the five suspects face civil fines and the loss of their hunting privileges, but they will also have to reimburse the citizens of Idaho \$750 for each of the two illegally killed elk.

- Good Guy Camp (location HENRY) is in. Wall tent and wood stove put up Oct. 6. Rhodesy flagged the trail down well with hot pink ribbon. It is steep in spots so tie your loads down tight for the .55 mile ride. When you hit the bottom at FS trail 50 (Cut50xing), you will ride left (downriver) and immediately cross Montana Creek with a foot bridge at it. You will then ride one mile and cross Spotted Louis Creek. 200 yards after you cross Spotted Louis Creek, you will come to 104 and 50. There is a well defined trail from that exact spot out to your right the will take you 100 yards to location HENRY. You should be able to see the wall tent from the trail 104 and 50 intersection. Attached are a few photos.

- Up to Avery yesterday posting Moose Alert signs in lower drainage
- No vehicles at location SAM. All up at locations ADAM & BOY by now I'm sure
- There is diesel at the St. Joe Oil tanks right above location SAM in Avery....gas card. Both diesel pumps there are large filler tube handles for log truck tanks. I do have a large funnel at the cabin in the woodshed to help fill the UC. I think the tip is small enough (?). I will bring a long handled screw driver as well and put it in the console, just stick it down the tube to open the flapper and fill gingerly. I will also fill four 5 gallon Geri cans with diesel and have them at the cabin with my filler spout. I will go over the UC today to fill with diesel, fix the mirror, make sure of a jack & lug wrench, strap the spare tire.....etc.
- I bought two new camera batteries for the small, lightweight night scope Greg. They and it will go with 111 in the UC and he will give it to you at Conrad at 1200 hours on the 12th. He will also give you the Good Guys my hand held radio with an extra battery pack, all charged.
- You CANNOT hit the FG Sisters repeater from location HENRY. You CAN hit FS Snow Peak repeater from location HENRY, but you can only talk to me in my 114 rig (in code) and I hope to be able to talk back with you if that is necessary (???) You MAY be able to hit FG Sisters repeater farther up the ridge towards Snow Peak? You should be able to talk with 110 at any time C to C and they can relay to me. Short, concise info. is all that is necessary I believe.
- Bring your FRS's to scan and listen to channel 3 for bad guy traffic. They are supposed to check in each night at dark and report.
- If you walk out onto the rocks into the middle of the LNFC River just upstream 50 yards from location HENRY - you can use the Satellite Phone. I talked with Carrie at home for almost 2 minutes without interruption from there.
- Let's have three check in times during every day (if possible) for the Good Guys and 110/119 at 1000, at 1500 and at 2000 hours to relay information, safety, plans, needs and status to 114. You may have to relay thru 110, but I will keep a log and help with overall bad guy operations & strategy.
- Cell phones will be a waste of time for the Good Guys. MAYBE 110 could get out, but he will have a sure fire SAT phone connection.
- Everyone take LOTS of photos for case purposes, power point, Christmas party and just fun.
- We all still need SAT phone numbers for 110 & 119 and for the Good Guys.
- I will begin license look ups today and get bad guy home phone numbers to have at the cabin.
- I will bring my horse and mule and they will be at the cabin (114, 130's?, 111, 115 & 116's 10-42) from the 12th thru the 17th if needed. Horse trailer has no plates and can be towed with UC or 130's rig.
- I will be in uniform, in my marked rig, on the air from daylight to dark and in the upper Joe or up on the 201 road unless otherwise directed. I will monitor the radio and SAT phone to at least 2200 hours each night and by 0600 each morning.
- Sounds like the weather will be cold and clear so bring lots of warm clothing - better to have too much than not enough.
- 130 will be on the loose each day and/or constant surveillance with video camera at location SAM.
- Bring DNA kits for meat samples or gut pile samples.
- I think 205 has location codes for everyone now.....
- If you hear a shot - get on the air for sure and monitor FRS.

- Josh is getting us any time contact numbers for Judge McGee if and when we need a warrant or two. Everyone but WMA operatives – bring a full uniform with your FG rig at the cabin and we should bring our warrant kits as well. It may go down during or shortly thereafter our operation.
- I will have groceries at the cabin for 6 guys for 6 days, lunches as well.
- Remember, the spot clear up against the propane tanks behind the cabin is reserved for the UC rig, night and day.
- We will plan for us all to be in position by the night of the 12th and out early the morning of the 13th.
- Add the following to your code sheet to refer to:

#1 is Wes Hixson

#2 is Buck Moore

#3 is Mike Hixson

#4 is Dan Castner

5 is Jeff Moore

Refer to every other bad guy as PERIPHERY. Whether you know his identity at the time or not.

**1130 – 114 sees Red Ford with commemorative front license
plate at Buck Moore residence. (Clarence or John Mathews)**

**1415 – 111 reports that Ford Ranger (12 AF) is going down
Bluff creek, 2 horses loaded, no sign of elk kill. All of original 6
vehicles are still at Bathtub trailhead.**

**1930 – 111 reports that Washington horse camp out Snow
Peak way plans on staying through Oct. 18.**

October 13

1730 – 121 reports that Jim, Wes, Ron & Doc Ramsey have a bull down in Culdesac creek, got this morning. Gut pile 40 yards from salt lick. May have 2 elk down? They brought 4 mules down in draw to pack out this bull. Back to Badhorse camp with it tonight. FRS communications from Badhorse out to someone (Buck) in Badcamp to have Mike bring something tomorrow, will take meat out tomorrow. Will FRS again tonight 1830-1900.

1755 – 121 identifies a bull being packed, horse traffic coming at them, pulling out, talk car to car in 30 minutes.

2000 – 114 leaves SAT phone & cell messages with 110 at Snow Peak on our plan of attack tomorrow.

October 14

0800 – 114 radio contact with 110 & 119 to go clear the Perch and Spotted Louis Pt. overlooking Culdesac creek so 121 can go in to get meat sample off of gut pile and salt lick sample down in Culdesac creek.

0945 – 110 tells 121 that the ridge is void of bad guys, 121 going out to get samples then, 110 & 119 back up to Snow Peak then. Back to Snow Peak in one hour.

1047 – 110/119 back at Snow Peak, bumped guy in his 20's headed down towards Perch, 110 thinks he's from another camp though, 121 still headed down in.

1103 – 121 radios 110 that 205 should be at Spotted Louis Pt.

1109 – 116 radios 111 that there are 2 periphery headed to Bathtub trailhead (111 location), not Mike Hixson.

1115 – 121 radios that salt site in Culdesac is not solid violation, DNA sample off bull, broken antler pieces on site, ravens nearby might be another gut pile ?

1120 – 111 radios that Wes Hixson is approaching Bathtub trailhead on horseback with meat on mules.

1123 – 115 & 116 reports that Mike Hixson is at Mammoth in light blue car, headed to Bathtub now to meet Wes Hixson with meat.

1127 – 121 is beginning his log walk down and out of Culdesac creek.

1222 – 130 stationed down 1258 at mm7 on spur road looking back over at Badcamp ridge. He hears 4 rapid shots over by Salt 1.

1243 – 121 checks in, he is still 1.5 hours from the bottom.

1307 – 111 reports that Wes, Mike, Ramsey & Fisher are headed from Bathtub to Mammoth campground with bull. Oregon Dodge with Wes & Fisher and Ramsey & Mike Hixson are in passenger car.

1318 – 115 reports that both rigs are at Mammoth now.

1329 – 111 reports hearing them saying that they had not tag at Bathtub.

1340 – 115 reports that Mike Hixson & Ramsey are going back to Bathtub , they said they forgot the antlers.

1344 – 115 reports that a Proxy statement is being written at Mammoth right now, he thinks the bull is going to Buck Moore's in Avery.

1355 – 111 reports that Mike Hixson car with Ramsey is headed back to Mammoth now.

1402 – Mike Hixson car at Mammoth dropped off Ramsey.

1421 – Wes & Fisher leave in Oregon rig east, Mike & Ramsey leave west in passenger car. Bull still in Oregon rig. Oregon rig headed to Badcamp now.

1430 – 114 leaves to trail 130 that is following the Mike Hixson car for a possible stop near St. Maries.

1439 – 115 & 111, bull is still in Mammoth campground and Oregon rig with Fisher & Wes shows up at Bathtub trailhead.
*115/116 want a pickup time from 111 at 1450.

1445 – 114 out the 201 road, back around Bear Skull to Trimmed Tree Hill above Mammoth.

1811 – 115 headed to meet 111 in UC rig.

1830 – 110/119 report that ruckus (FRS traffic) was all about another bull being shot in Culdesac and that 3 guys were in the Perch.

1855 – 110 SAT phones & radios to 114 that 3 guys killed a bull down in Culdesac this evening.

1910 – 110 radios 121 that bull is down under Spotted Louis Pt.

1914 – 114...”did they go to the bull this evening?”

110...”Yes, he believes so.”

- **110/119 off the air.**

October 15

0745 – 110 reports second bull taken out of Culdesac and at least headed to Badhorse camp, maybe Bathtub trailhead. Socked in up there, raining, with 50 MPH winds.

0805 – 114 radios 111 to relay those events, we decide that 111’s crew should continue with their missions on Salt 1 & Salt 2 for John Mathews, Clarence Mathews, Rich Eddy or Buck Moore hunting over.

0823 – 114 intercepts FRS 7...sounds like John or Clarence and Buck “we’re headed to Avery!” 114 sends 130 to Avery for surveillance.

0839 – 114 radios 110 with information from 111, informed him that C.I. is headed into Badhorse camp & Bull 2 is probably OK by process of elimination off tag list.

0856 – 111 is at Salt 2 and 121 reports he has brass from the Perch.

1016 – 130 radios from Avery that Buck and maybe John Mathews(later found to be Clarence Mathews) are at Buck’s house in Avery with Buck’s truck. 7B white GMC there as well

1108 – 130 calls 114 on my cell from Avery, Buck & Clarence unloaded wood at Buck's then backed into garage to unload something that was under the wood.

1228 – 130 calls again from Avery. He says there is a big deer or calf elk hanging in Buck's garage now, thinks they brought it in under the wood. 130 watched them cut and load that wood yesterday below Badcamp.

1245 – 130 reports that Buck Moore & Clarence just dumped calf elk parts into the Avery dumpster.

1313 – 130 reports that Buck is leaving his house and headed back up to Badcamp or Mammoth.

1320 – 130 takes few more photos, seize calf elk parts and then head up to meet me with thermometer.

1400 – 111 reports intercepting FRS that C.I. and son are packing up at Badhorse and riding out soon to Bathtub.

1409 – 121 reports that Ron is the one that shot Bull 2 (5x4), Bull 2 is coming out today or tomorrow. * 2 periphery coming in from Bathtub and C.I. & son going out now.

1412 – 110/119 say they are coming out tomorrow. 121 will be at Perch Trail this evening.

1418 – 121 says Bull 1 (Ramsey bull) was taken out with Doc Ramsey this morning.

1525 – 110/119 will be off the air for awhile headed down to head of Culdesac creek.

1538 – 114 radios 121 that periphery are at Spotted Louis Pt. via FRS traffic, 121 says there are 3 periphery at Spotted Louis Pt.

1541 – 111 reports that Bull 1 is gone now from Mammoth, 111 says they verified directly that John Mathews is on Salt 2, (130 thought that John Mathews was with Buck down at Avery and we found out later that it was Clarence Mathews).

1544 – 111, 115 & 116 headed down to Badcamp ridge and screw in.

1607 – 121/205 riding horses right up to Spotted Louis Pt. to see what periphery just shot in Culdesac creek.

1608 – 130 up with me now says that untagged calf in Buck's garage, Buck & someone with limp cleaned knives, bloody tarp in back of Buck's truck, 130 then saw them dump parts in Avery dumpster.

1615 – 121 heading down into Culdesac to see what they shot.

1622 – 111 & crew searching down off Salt 1 ridge for calf elk gut pile now.

1625 – Pharyngeal temp. on calf elk is 55 degrees F.

1637 – 121 is at the Perch and he thinks periphery are now down below him in Culdesac. 121 radio with 110 and I can't hear 110.

1641 – 121 headed out to Spotted Louis Pt. now, 110 radio with 121, 110/119 starting back up to Snow Peak but monitoring all radios for 121.

1642 – Esophagus up into base of skull, down deep neck meat temp. is 68 degrees F.

1645 – 114 & 130 found bullet hole in hide and shop rag (white) up in head. Several finishing shots in head.

1711 – 121 at Spotted Louis Pt., all is quiet.

1714 – 121 headed to their camp.

1830 – 130 & 114 moved to Trimmed Tree Hill to meet up with 111, 115 & 116. 130 radioed 107 to see if Ramsey Araj stopped and checked his bull (Bull 1) at the St. Maries check station during checking hours. 107 reported via data that Ramsey did not stop and check that bull.

October 16

0745 – 114 advised 110/119 to pack up and head for Bathtub trailhead, meet FS 22 + 1 there, identify and contact Wes Hixson & Badhorse camp periphery coming out with Bull 2.

- 114 advised 121/205 to pack up, head for Badcamp area and contact 111 for further.
- 111,115,116 to make PC contact on John Mathews & Rich Eddy and begin citations, 114 to assist when that happens.
- 130 to Buck's house to secure calf elk.

This operation was a three year dream come true. Thanks to each and every one of you !!!!! Paybacks are expected.

My only disappointments:

1. There were not evidently any cow elk presented to the bad guys in our work area or I know they would have killed them early. To have us all up and running so flawlessly and not have more crime go down was frustrating, but we got a lot any way I guess.

Outfitter charged with poaching

A Shoshone County man has been arrested in what is being called one of the largest illegal hunting operations in the state of Idaho.

The arrest of James L. Wilson, 67, of Calder, followed a monthlong undercover operation by state and federal officials detailing his alleged illegal hunting and guiding along the St. Joe River and the Little North Fork of the Clearwater River.

"This is the worst case I've ever seen in the state," Shoshone County Prosecutor Jannece-Marie Skeen said. "A huge amount of evidence was seized."

Wildlife officials are investigating Wilson's employees and associates as the officials collect allegedly illegally taken fish and wildlife from homes and vehicles across the region. No other arrests have been made, but 1st District Magistrate Daniel McGee sealed court documents Monday to protect the ongoing investigation.

Wilson's charging papers state he unlawfully killed or possessed a bear, seven elk, wild turkey and cutthroat trout during October. Officials allege he also traded cutthroat trout for alcoholic beverages. Unlawful exchange of wildlife is a felony.

Wilson also is charged with felony possession and killing of wildlife and unlawful outfitting and guiding, a misdemeanor. If convicted, Wilson faces more than 10 years in prison and \$100,000 in fines. He remains in Shoshone County Jail on \$100,000 bond.

A public defender had not been assigned to Wilson by Monday afternoon.

Agents said Wilson operated an unlicensed outfitting business named Call of the Wild. In October, wildlife agents - posing as clients - accompanied Wilson on several guided trips where "illegal activity took place," according to a statement from the Idaho Fish and Game Department. Wilson was charged late Friday afternoon.

"This is a very significant case," said Dean Sangrey, executive director of the Idaho Outfitters and Guides Board. "I'm very pleased to see these initial results."

Jerry Hugo, a senior conservation officer for Fish and Game, said the "ring of intentional poachers" had devastating effects on the area's wildlife populations.

"They were taking a lot of fish and game using illegal methods during closed seasons and using transferred tags," Hugo said. "In several instances, fish and game were taken without any licenses or tags."

An annual outfitter's license costs \$300, plus insurance and training for guides. Licensed guides must obtain special-use permits to take clients on

federal and state land.

Mark Henderson of Granite Outfitters Inc., licensed to guide in the Coeur d'Alene River drainage, said "Call of the Wild" infringed on his area and that of several other guides.

"It's a big deal when someone is illegally operating in your area," Henderson said. "It's very frustrating. It's robbing me of my income."

Unlicensed guides typically advertise by word-of-mouth, on Internet Web pages or in small out-of-state newspapers.

"We have problems with illegal outfitters all the time," said Tom Loder, chairman of the Panhandle chapter of the state's outfitters and guide board.

"They're not equipped, and they're not trained," Loder said. "It's a widespread problem."

The state licenses more than 400 outfitting businesses each year. A state official said Wilson never held a license in Idaho, and that he likely operated illegally for several years.

"There's been a lot poaching going on for years," said Hugo, the conservation officer who first investigated Wilson. "We just want to make sure we get it stopped."

Son says dad no poacher, just braggart

Prosecutors believe they have one of the most prolific poachers in the state in James Lavenen Wilson, a frail 57-year-old Calder man who has bounced from job to job.

Wilson's son says they have an alcoholic with a third-grade education who bragged on a bar stool of his hunting exploits on the St. Joe River. "The old man is capable of telling a good story," said Brandon Wilson of Spokane. "He blew himself up to be this great white hunter. (But) if they wanted to eliminate poaching in Idaho, they barked up the wrong tree."

On Friday, Wilson appeared before 1st District Magistrate Daniel McGee on two felony charges and one misdemeanor for illegal activities on the St. Joe and the North Fork of the Clearwater River.

McGee agreed to postpone Wilson's preliminary hearing for 30 days while a defense is prepared.

In court records, James Wilson misspelled the name of his hometown and listed his assets as \$40 and a truck worth \$1,200.

But the U.S. Fish and Game Department considers Wilson part of a ring of intentional poachers whose network is still being uncovered.

Authorities say they have seized a substantial amount of evidence and are investigating several other suspects.

"Everybody tells fish stories," said Jannece-Marie Skeen, deputy prosecutor for Shoshone County. "We would never go forward with charges that we didn't have evidence to support."

If convicted, Wilson faces 10 years in prison and \$100,000 in fines. He remains in the Shoshone County Jail on \$100,000 bond, and has declined interview requests.

Brandon Wilson said his father hasn't killed an elk since the late 1970s, and that years of alcohol abuse have left him too weak to effectively hunt large game.

"He's a really good liar," Wilson said. "He admitted to me that he had said he had killed these elk. This is all based on his word."

"He's a chronic storyteller," said James' sister, Diane Pearl of Baxter, Minn.

Authorities say Wilson's fish stories - whether fact or fiction - led them to a large-scale poaching ring.

Wildlife agents arrested Wilson Oct. 25 following an undercover investigation.

County and state officials said the arrest was the just the beginning in an extensive sting involving large quantities of illegally taken fish and wildlife and a number of suspects.

More than a week after Wilson's arrest, no other charges have been filed and no one else has been arrested in connection with the case.

"With animals, it takes a long time to analyze the evidence," Skeen said. "There is a substantial amount of evidence."

The investigation began when authorities learned of Wilson's unlicensed photo guide service named Call of the Wild. Two agents from the Idaho Outfitters and Guide Enforcement Unit posed as clients. Wilson agreed to lead the agents on a hunting trip for \$300, with another \$700 promised for a successful kill.

"What we thought three weeks ago was a simple case has suddenly blown into something much bigger," Skeen said.

Wilson led multiple out-of-state groups, including one with eight people, Skeen said.

In Shoshone County - where three-quarters of the county is federal land - prosecutors have cracked down on poaching, prosecuting one hunter last year for failing to attach his tag to a deer six hours after he shot it.

Another Shoshone hunter was charged this fall with a felony for shooting a cow moose in a clearing without a tag. The hunter was turned in by his friends.

"He will do time," Skeen promised.

"Fish and game belong to all of us," she said. "In my county, I will prosecute those violations."

Wilson is charged with exchanging wildlife - a felony - for trading cutthroat trout for alcoholic beverages. He is also charged with felony possession and killing of wildlife and unlawful outfitting and guiding, a misdemeanor.

Dean Sangrey, executive director of the Outfitters and Guides Licensing Board, said the arrest sends a "strong message."

Sangrey emphasized that obtaining a license is an extensive process including background checks, first aid training and liability insurance, among other fees.

In addition to illegally guiding, Wilson's charging papers state that he unlawfully killed or possessed a bear, seven elk, wild turkey and cutthroat trout during October.

According to the state, Wilson does have state hunting and fishing licenses, as well as deer and black bear tags. Authorities say that they believe more than one bear was taken.

A Fish and Game inventory list dated Oct. 25 shows that guns, ammunition and beer were found at Wilson's trailer or in his car, but no animal remains are listed.

At least six search warrants for vehicles and homes were served, according to the state.

"The evidence will speak for itself," said Jerry Hugo, a senior conservation officer with Fish and Game. "It is an extensive case."

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
